City Civics Day is part of the City's commitment to build more robust and effective civic infrastructure, anchored by the pillars of the Citywide Plan: arts and culture; food access; entrepreneurship; housing and neighborhoods; lifelong learning; public health and safety; and transportation and infrastructure.

City Civics Day was produced by the **Department of Planning and Development** and the **Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events**. The event was held at Malcolm X College, an accessible, centralized location on Chicago's Near West Side.


